Action for Children become FirstGroup's next charity partner

FirstGroup's new three-year partnership with Action for Children begins on 1st April, worth around £1m in cash, fundraising, and the commercial value of gifts in kind.

The partnership aims to support some of the UK's most disadvantaged children by funding mental health projects, enabling the delivery of essential specialist programmes to young people who need them. The partnership will also raise awareness of the issue, by utilising advertising space across FirstGroup's UK transport network.

Shockingly, around three children in every classroom is suffering from a diagnosable mental health disorder. The children and young people Action for Children support have often experienced traumatic childhoods, leading to poor emotional health and well-being. Our partnership will enable Action for Children to deliver that essential mental health support to young people who need it.

The importance of having a Will

Will writing can be daunting, but it is essential to help plan for the future and provide security for your loved ones.

Having a Will can reduce the inheritance tax paid on your estate (everything you own). Currently, 40% tax is paid on estates over £325,000. A solicitor will be able to advise you on how to reduce this.

You can be at peace, knowing that your wishes will be carried out and your family and friends will be cared for.

At Action for Children we were very fortunate to receive hundreds of gifts in Will, last year — totalling over £4m. Thanks to this special way of giving, we can develop innovative and specialised services, supporting hundreds of thousands of children.
