#### **Church news**

As yet we have had no information about congregational singing. Several people have commented that they would like to be able to sing safely distanced. So, before we consider moving chairs closer together to enable a single Sunday morning service, it has been decided that the chairs will remain spaced as they are until we know more about when we can sing, and the safe distance required between singers.

Many of you will be aware that during the bad weather the church roof was damaged along the side alley. Scaffolding has now been erected down the side passage to enable access to the roof. The scaffolding also includes roofing over the alleyway, which will allow people to walk down it, but it is very narrow in places making it unsuitable for walking frames. Roofers are very busy at the moment, but we hope the repair work will start in the next few days.

## Coffee at church

Coffee is now being served between the Sunday services. Serving starts from 10.30 a.m. The chairs have been set out to comply with current regulations, so please do not move chairs and remember that you cannot stand to drink your coffee. Please sanitise your hands on entering the hall. You must wear a mask while walking around the hall and waiting for your coffee. If you are attending the second service after coffee, please enter church via South Street for track and trace purposes. Thanks to Colin and Diana Tizzard who put out the coffee tables and chairs every week. Please help to stack tables and chairs after coffee if you are able.

#### Saying Goodbye (part of the Mariposa Trust)

are returning to Wimborne in July with a baby loss remembrance and support service (part of a nationwide chain of events) on **11th July at 3.30pm in Wimborne Minster** 

Founded in 2012 The Mariposa Trust's core objective is to support people who have lost babies at any stage of pregnancy, at birth, or in infancy. With over 258,000 babies being lost yearly in the UK alone, the charity offers not only a comprehensive package of befriending and support but also national baby loss remembrance services (called Saying Goodbye services) for people to join together and remember the children they have lost.

So who is the service for? Anyone who has either personally lost a baby at any stage of pregnancy, at birth, or in infancy, or who has been affected by a family member's or a friend's loss. Whether the loss was recent or 80 years ago, everyone is welcome to attend. We also welcome anyone who is grieving the fact that they haven't had children. This may be due to circumstance, infertility or for other reasons - but all are welcome. Babies and children are also invited to come with their family as the Saying Goodbye service is truly a family event for all.
