## URC 'Council for World Mission' Report

Council for World Mission (CWM) highlights the Covid-19 epidemic that affects all its member churches. Often this is against a background of inequality, lack of health care, social deprivation and overwhelming loss. There is particular concern about the measles epidemic in Samoa and the struggle for freedom in West Papua. We also need to be concerned and pray for the people of Yemen, who face starvation, war and lack of facilities during the Covid-19 pandemic.

In the Philippines, the Human Rights crisis has been escalating. An International Ecumenical Convocation on Human Rights was held on 17<sup>th</sup> September, on-line, in an attempt to act on this issue.

The English forum of PCS (Presbyterian Church of Singapore) gathered together 75 church leaders virtually in August. They met to discuss 'rethinking the church' – making the transition between online and on-site church services.

The UCYAAM (the United Church of Jamaica and the Cayman islands) brought together 100 young people for an e-conference, the theme of which was 'Mobilised to Act at such a time as this' Over 4 days they studied the book of Esther, with reference to using their own talents. Presenters from various backgrounds, worked to equip the participants for church ministry and in the workplace.

It appears as if member churches are using their resources of modern technology to discern how best to present the gospel in the present situation.
