CHRISTIAN AID WEEK (10-16 MAY 2015)

The theme this year is **'TRANSFORMING LIVES'**.

This Christian Aid Week will focus on how funding can transform lives; sponsoring projects to help people produce food for themselves in a world where one in eight people go hungry every day. It focuses on people like Loko, who lives in a remote corner of Ethiopia and whose life can be transformed by Christian Aid sponsorship of only £5 from a harsh existence of bare subsistence to where she can set up a sustainable business to feed her family.

Christian Aid Week May 10 – 16 2015

This year Christian Aid celebrates its 70th anniversary.

In May 1945 the leaders of the main churches in Britain asked that on the Sunday after VE Day – Victory in Europe, 8 May – Christians should resist celebrating a victory and instead donate what they could afford to help reconstruct Europe. More than £3 million in today's money was raised that weekend.

Anne Booth-Clibborn has recounted her experiences at that time. In 1945 she was a 19-year-old ambulance driver in London, familiar with the destruction in the East End. She was then posted as a staff car driver in occupied Germany. Nothing she had seen in London had prepared her for the devastation she saw there. She drove mile upon mile through the Ruhr and saw only bombed out, roofless buildings, and roads clogged with homeless, hungry refugees. She and other witnesses of this scale of suffering were moved to take action to help these people.

Christian Aid was among the several humanitarian agencies that took shape then, resolved to help create a better future for those less fortunate than themselves. The charity has continued to respond with financial and practical help to the disasters and human needs that have punctuated the decades since, not just in Europe but throughout the world.

Please give what you can afford, knowing that it will be put to good use. Thank you.
