Health and Safety Incident

Recently one of our church members came into the church early in the morning and found a gentleman on the premises. He wouldn't leave, so she wisely left. A few minutes later a coffee shop volunteer arrived, again alone and found the gentleman, who this time agreed to leave. We think he must have got in through an unlocked door (we all forget to lock our doors occasionally) after the full building alarm was automatically turned off. The premises are alarmed overnight and it would be very difficult to be in the building at night and not set them off.

These incidents have been reported to the Police whose advice is, that if this happens again, to leave the building immediately and phone 101. However if the person is abusive in any way, to leave the building and ring 999. This very rarely happens, but it is important that everyone knows how to deal with such situations.

Also do not give anyone money, if they ask. If they are hungry and the coffee shop is shut, go next door and buy a sandwich. The church will reimburse you. If they need accommodation give them the number of the street homeless outreach team (SHOT) 01305 760799.
