MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL OF STEWARDS

We are concerned that on a number of occasions recently the door lock on the door in Charles Street, opposite the library, has been overridden leaving it unlocked when the building be secure and locked.

Please be aware that this lock must not be overridden leaving the door unlocked and unattended.

There are a number of reasons for this but one of the main reasons is that if someone was to gain access to the building and something was to happen while it is meant to be locked eg theft, criminal damage, public liability claim, our insurance would probably be void and would not pay out.

The advice to lock the doors was given by the Dorset Police Crime Prevention Officer and was not simply in response to the issues we had been having with teenagers and the associated safeguarding problems.

Locking the doors is primarily for crime prevention and also to ensure we are all safeguarded.

If you see the door is unlocked when it is not scheduled to be then please close it firmly and when you leave please make sure the door is firmly closed behind you'.

The door should only be unlocked at the following times:

Monday – Friday : 8.30am – 12.30pm (except when the Blood Donor sessions are taking place)

Saturday: 8am - 1.30pm Sunday: 9.30am - 10.30am

DORSET HISTORIC CHURCHES RIDE AND STRIDE - SATURDAY 9 SEPTEMBER 2017

Dorset Historic Churches Trust provides funds to help churches and parishes keep their buildings weatherproof, warm and available for worship and wider public use.

In recent years it has helped with grants for the addition of kitchens and toilets to increase usability of buildings which have traditionally only been used on Sundays.

In 2016 the Trust awarded grants totalling £100,000 to 25 churches. Over the past three years a number of our members at UCD have taken part in the event and received sponsorship, half of which comes straight back to UCD.

Most of the Trust's income comes from the Ride and Stride and last year almost £81,000 was raised in sponsorship by participants of all ages and abilities with 50% of all money pledged returned by the Trust to churches nominated by the riders or striders, so everyone benefits.
