The Quaker Service Exhibition in Dorchester - October 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> 2018

Quakers have been well known for their peace work over many generations, work which still continues in a quiet, effective way now. From October 1<sup>st</sup> to October 6<sup>th</sup> 2018, Dorchester Quakers are holding an exhibition about this work in the foyer of the United Church in South Street Dorchester (DT1 1BY).

The exhibition shows the various forms that this work took before and during the First and Second World Wars (including the Friends' Ambulance Service), in the turbulent times around the world after the Second World War, and continues now.

It is hoped that the viewing times will be Mon, Tues, Wed and Fri in the United Church foyer from 10am to 2pm, and later in the day on Friday October 6<sup>th</sup> at the Meeting House in Holloway Road, Fordington, DT1 1LF.

## The Sound System

For a while, many of you have been experiencing problems with the quality of sound from the sound system. As a result the Stewards have agreed that it needs replacing. We are currently considering the design requirements. However, the installation of a new sound system and loop in the hall is already in progress and the installers hope to be able to begin work in September. Clearly, we need to wait and see what the new system in the hall is like but, in the meantime, we plan to discuss with the installers a design for a new system in the church.

Since there is nothing in this year's budget to pay for a new church sound system, the quote we get from the installers will allow us to bring a motion to the November church meeting for approval to spend as soon as we are ready. Clearly, if the new system in the hall does not live up to our expectations, we will have to look for another supplier, but they have a good reputation. This should improve the sound quality for most of the time BUT, please remember, whatever we do, any system is only as good as the quality of sound that goes in. If preachers mumble or make quiet asides, then it doesn't matter how good the system, poor quality sound will come out of the PA speakers. Similarly, if you use a hearing aid, you will always get the best sound by using the loop via the T setting on your hearing aid.

Keep your ears open; better sound is coming soon.
