At the morning service on 23<sup>rd</sup> June, led by Rev David Reep, we will have a guest speaker, Lis Webb. Her talk is about 'Japan - land without the Risen Son'. She works with OMF (formerly China Inland Mission) and is coming to talk about Japan, its people and how God is using OMF missionaries there; her son and daughter-in-law have been serving God in Japan for over 8 years. She has visited them several times to spend time with the family and observe their ministry. Lis is not asking us to support a missionary, she just wants to spread the word about how mission works in a very different culture.

## **Holiday Lunch Club**

The Holiday Lunch Club, which offers food parcels to families who struggle during the long summer holiday to feed their children, is starting to plan for summer 2019. Last year over 80 local families applied for help and a total of 251 parcels were distributed. Parcels contain fresh meat, cheese, eggs, ham, fruit and vegetables, as well as non-perishable items such as pasta, rice, tinned fruit etc. A voucher is also provided to help with buying toiletries and baby food. Last year £7,500 was donated by local organisations, charitable trusts and individuals to enable this to happen. One fundraiser to raise money for both the holiday lunch club and food bank was the Gorgeous Garments event in May. Within the first 30 minutes £400 had been raised, and the total raised was £1400. Thank you to everyone who donated clothes to this event.
