Community Outreach Worker/Pastoral Worker

We are looking for a creative, collaborative, inspirational person to help develop outreach initiatives in the community and to offer pastoral care. Work will primarily be in the Dorchester area, initially with United Church Dorchester.

The Dorset South & West Circuit was formed on 1 September 2018 and is committed to lay and ordained staff working innovatively together both to care for existing Church members and to work with Churches to discern and help develop fresh mission opportunities in the community.

United Church Dorchester is a single-congregation Local Ecumenical Partnership between the United Reformed and Methodist Churches. It is part of the Circuit (as above) and of the Bridport & Dorchester URC Pastorate.

The successful applicant will be self-motivating, able to motivate others and prepared to be at the start of something new with all the challenges that brings. They will be an accredited lay preacher (or equivalent).

This is a part time appointment (15 hours weekly) with a salary of £8,307 per annum (based on £10.65 an hour).

Satisfactory Enhanced Disclosure from DBS will be required. There is an Occupational Requirement that the post holder is a Christian.
