Christmas Shoe Boxes

We have decided this year to support a scheme run by the UK charity Foundation for Social Change and Inclusion, based at St Paul's Church, Salisbury.

The charity works to break the cycle of poverty and marginalisation for some of the most vulnerable individuals and communities in south east Europe. They prevent exploitation and human trafficking, helping to effect positive change throughout the region. Those who will receive a Christmas shoe box include abandoned children living in state care, poor rural schools and kindergartens, women's refuges, prisoners' children, isolated elderly people, refugees and Roma children living in difficult conditions.

Shoebox leaflets will be available from September in both foyers and the boxes will be dedicated by Rev Peter Cark on Sunday 17 November. All boxes must be received by this date.

Vision Day III

The third Vision Day is to be held at UCD on 14th September and led by Mark Tizzard (Tizz). There will be tea and coffee available from 9.30am, the meeting starting at 10am and finishing by 3.30pm, with a bring and share lunch at around midday.

After an introduction to the day and a recap of the Vision Days I & II, groups will discuss and develop (from Vision Day II) the **4 Types of Work:**

Relational - Meeting people, making friends and raising profile

Intro - An introduction to UCD, how this church works, meeting Stewards and Officers etc plus opportunities for getting involved

An introduction to basic Christian beliefs

Deeper - Discipleship, new Christians, growing faith

Active - Growing leaders

Finally, in groups, we will ask ourselves: what is God's plan for this church and community, how do we plan for change, what support / money do we need to move on, what is our plan of action?
