#### The Vision for UCD: a Message from Rev John and the Council of Stewards

**Friends,** as winter begins to give way to spring, and as 2024 continues, I invite you to join me and the Church Stewards on a journey to set the vision for United Church Dorchester for the next 10 years and beyond.

**Can you believe...** that is it nearly 25 years since the United Church Dorchester embarked on a spirit led, bold vision for the Millennium. Which saw tireless work from so many people across the church community, gathering to discern where God was leading our church. Eventually turning dreams into a reality through the purchase of 51 Charles Street, much fund-raising, and importantly teams of people focused on how the new building facilities were going to be used for worship and mission, and many other things besides.

The stewards and I believe that God is calling us again to look at the long-term vision of United Church. Not merely talking and dreaming dreams, but coming up with actions and milestones that will steer United Church into the next phase of its worship, mission and presence in Dorchester. There is **so** much to build upon, to learn and to continue within the life of our Church. **Yet** we believe in a God that is constantly at work shaping and guiding his kingdom into growth.

So at our Annual Church Meeting on **Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> April, 7pm** we will be starting the process of hearing your views around the shape of our Church for the next few years.

We need you to PRAY, and listen to where God is prompting our fellowship to direct its energy and resources in the coming years. Could you be part of a team specifically looking at one of these areas of our vision, enabling it to become a reality?

Here are areas of church life that we have identified that it would be helpful for us to focus our conversations and emerging vision upon:

- **Fellowship & Learning.** How can we grow in faith together? Are you a member of a small group? How could we explore the Bible together? Should we try Alpha or a Seekers Course?
- What is Church For? What are we here to do? How do we reach new people?
- Worship. What makes worship meaningful? What could we try in Worship to bring it alive?
- **Reaching Families and Children.** Building on our great Sunday School, Forest Praise and Story-tots groups, how might we reach the missing generations in our community?
- **Social.** What types of event would you like us to try, so that we can meet together socially? We may need to fundraise, could you help us with that?
- **How do we use our building?** The building is the base for all we do at UCD, do we need to use our building differently to meet the needs of our community and our mission goals for 2024 and beyond?
- **Serving our Community.** What can we offer to the meet the needs of Dorchester? What can we build on that we are already doing? Are there new partners we could work with to achieve this?

#### A prayer, adapted from the Millennium Project prayer, to aid our thoughts and conversations:

Living God, we thank you for every opportunity of serving you, one another and our whole community, here in the heart of Dorchester. We pray now for a deeper understanding of your vision for this Church, that it might continue to grow as a place of welcome, love and friendship to all people. Open our eyes, hearts and minds as we give thanks for all that has been, as we eagerly explore all you call us to do in the future, and as we attend the needs, hopes and aspirations of the present. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
