Church Services

The Council of Stewards has decided to re-start live worship on Palm Sunday, 28th March. There will be two services, at 10am and 11.15am, just as we had before the latest lockdown. People will have to book for Sunday services, but with **John or Wendy Hilton**, preferably <u>by email</u>, or by leaving a message on the Church Office answerphone (01305 457477) which is checked daily.

- Please note that we put the clocks forward that weekend.
- Please wear a mask, sanitise your hands on entering church, have your name checked on the list and keep a safe distance from everyone else.
 Not everyone will have received their first vaccination yet.
- If you wish to chat to friends, please do this outside, before or after the service (at a safe distance). Remember on Palm Sunday the maximum group outside is two and it does not increase to six until the following day.
- On Sundays the chairs will be sanitised between services.

If you do not feel ready to come back to church, printed services will still be available as well as a YouTube service and a Zoom service at 5pm.

The first week will be Holy Week, but it seems sensible not to have services on three consecutive days, so:

- There will NOT be a service on Wednesday, 31st March.
- There will be a Communion service at 7pm on Maundy Thursday, 1st April. Booking not required.
- There will NOT be a service on Good Friday, 2nd April.
- There will be two Communion services, at 10am and 11.15am, on Easter Sunday, 4th April.

On Good Friday, the circuit will provide a Zoom service for "the last hour" from 2pm to 3pm. The circuit will also be providing a package of written services to cover Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

After that, there will be two services each Sunday at 10am and 11.15am, and a Market Day service each Wednesday, but at the **new time** of **10.45am** to fit in with the local bus service.

Dear Friends,

We are sending through details of a District Challenge which has been organised with Christian Aid. As many of us, and our family and friends, are receiving the Covid vaccine we are inviting you to please donate to the work of Christian Aid on our own District giving page: https://giving.tapsimple.org/online/christian-aid/giving-thanks-for-our-vaccines-across-southampton-methodist-district.

Much of their work is across the world in areas where the vaccine will be rolled out in a much later, and slower, way than ours is being done. In order to ensure that the medical teams have all that they need to facilitate the roll-out of the vaccine the support from organisations like Christian Aid is vital.

We have set our District a challenge of raising at least £2,600 – representing our District number of 26! – so please do give as generously as you can and spread the word to family, friends and community groups so that we ask everyone to share the joy of getting their own vaccine with sisters and brothers around the world. We are also working on a press release to go to local news outlets and this should be available next week. Our suggested donation is £10 but please just give as you are able. (Note: click on 'custom amount' to choose your preferred donation, and where it asks for platform fees you can select 'other' and then zero.)

Let us not only meet our target but smash through it as we journey through the next few months. We also invite you to hold the work of Christian Aid in your prayers as they work on our behalf.

Christian Aid Week May 10-16

The current national restrictions concerning the Covid-19 pandemic have obviously had an impact on what we can offer this year during Christian Aid Week.

House to House collections: These remain a particular cause of uncertainty. It seems, in theory, that we can carry out these collections, within certain strict and detailed guidelines, made possible by the easing of some government restrictions on April 12. The Dorchester Christian Aid Committee will be meeting shortly after the news sheet goes to print and as yet no collective decision has been made as to whether these collections should take place here.

It may be that we do not go ahead in the traditional way but opt for 'delivery only' envelopes. There will also be envelopes in church for people to contribute. Even if we were to endorse House to House collections and we ask for volunteers we will obviously respect their decision if people decide they would not want to in the present climate. They should in no way feel obligated.

Regretfully government guidelines will not allow a Christian Aid Week market to be organised this year. The following are however scheduled:

Christian Aid Ecumenical Service (United Church): May 9 at 4.00 pm

Street Collection: provisionally booked for May 14

Sponsored walk to the River Jordan: provisionally booked for May 15

We hope the latter two will prove to be good fund raisers.

I am sorry if this all seems so unclear and unspecific but at the present time long-term planning is difficult indeed! Many thanks to:
