Dorchester Poverty Action (Registered Charity no. 1198452) Coffee Morning on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> July, 10-12 noon at United Church Dorchester Refreshments with homemade cakes, stalls and raffle

For over 30 years <u>this charity</u> has been helping local people (DT1 & DT2) at points of crisis by providing emergency grants of up to £250 via a professional's referral. During the cost of living crisis the charity saw a 47% increase in grants given out and the local community were incredibly generous in their support to enable the charity to meet these needs. In the last financial year referrals have returned to a more normal level, but still many people, especially those on Universal Credit, are finding it very difficult. These relatively small amounts of money can prevent debt, homelessness and acute stress. Please support the group's annual <u>coffee</u> <u>morning</u> to raise money to support more local people in some very difficult situations. If you have items to donate to stalls, please either bring on the day from 9am or let Wendy know after Wednesday 10 July.

# Tolpuddle Festival 2024 – Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> July

The annual <u>Tolpuddle Festival</u> will soon be upon us. Tolpuddle will be the focus for so many who will gather to meet people, especially from their Union. There will be various speakers and musicians on the main stage over the whole weekend. The Church plays its part over the weekend as the <u>New Methodist Chapel</u> is open for people to see the displays that tell the <u>story of the Methodist Tolpuddle Martyrs</u>, pick up some information and sit and reflect on the martyrs' lives and what they stood up for.

On the Festival site we will have a display in a gazebo outside the main tent to show how the <u>Methodist Church</u> is currently standing up for justice for all people, along with material to take away. Educational packs for children will also be available. There is a charge on the Saturday to go into the Festival area, but entrance to the churches is free. There are no Festival charges on Sunday.

We are delighted that the new <u>President, Rev Helen Cameron, and Vice-President, Mrs Carolyn Godfrey</u>, will be with us for the weekend. On <u>Sunday</u> at 2pm there is the parade through the village to which all are welcome to walk with the Tolpuddle Methodist banner and at 5pm there will be a Circuit Service at the New Chapel attended by the Vice-President along with our own minister, Revd John Yarrien.
