Vision and Property

We aspire to be a beacon of God's light and love for all in Dorchester and the building is a means to that end. We want the best building we can have for that purpose, not forgetting that upkeep and full utilisation of the building takes a lot of resources. Our most valuable resource is volunteers and we must recognise that in many areas of our church life the limiting factor is, and is likely to remain, the number of volunteers able to offer their services. This is why we had to consider whether new ways of using the building were needed.

We have had many meetings, large ones like the special church meeting and the AGM, meetings of committees and working groups, meetings with those who manage important areas of church life such as the recent one our minister had with those who manage the shop and coffee lounge. We want to consult widely but not to get lost in the mass of information, opinion and ideas which are generated. The difficulty is made worse by one potential project impacting on another, so that we need, together, to make difficult decisions about whether to delay project A because it would be more cost efficient to do project B first although B takes more planning and time! So we need to keep a clear head and sense of direction.

We want to keep you informed about progress and this is the first of a series of short articles in the News sheet on 'Vision and Property'.

- The idea of moving the shop to the South Street foyer has received little support.
- Having the shop and coffee lounge in the same area, originally suggested as a way of reducing the number of volunteers needed, has many positive features, making shoppers more likely to have a snack and snackers more likely to shop! The combination could enhance what is already a very important point of contact of our church with the wider community. If we were to put new toilets where the shop currently is and incorporate the current toilet area in the shop/coffee lounge it would solve the problem of refurbishing the toilets. A more attractive shopfront is a possibility. There are many problems to be solved, but further discussions are going to occur with those involved and, if the project appears to offer long term gains for our vision, we will ask an architect to assess the plan for feasibility and cost.
- We haven't forgotten the more radical suggestions of using the upper floor for offices or a caretaker's flat. We will try to assess the practicality of these ideas (for example, is office space currently sought after in Dorchester or is there an excess?).
- The identification and introduction of a digital management system is ongoing and could give major gains in terms of decreasing tasks and time on the premises for volunteers.

The charity booked to have a stall on the 18th June is the [Murugi Community Trust](#). The trust is based in Weymouth and works to relieve poverty, and to advance education and improve health for the public benefit primarily, but not exclusively, in the Murugi community area of Kenya by providing grants, items and services to Individuals in need, and to those organisations that support them. Those going out to Kenya return with bags, jewellery and crafts made by a group of single mothers in the Eastleigh District of Nairobi, and it is these which will be on sale at our Coffee Morning. All profits are used by the Trust to relieve poverty in the Murugi area. Do come along and see what these Kenyan ladies have made.

Keeping safe online

Silver Jubilee

This month, both the [church shop](#) and the [coffee shop](#) are celebrating 25 years since they first opened in June 2000. Their existence came about as the result of a Vision Day held in September 1997 and led by our then minister, Rev Barrie Snook, who challenged the members and friends present with the question "What does God want us to be and to do?". From this, the Millennium Project was born, about which Susy has written at greater length in the April/May Vision magazine.

The shop is open four mornings a week and there are photographs of all the current volunteers on one of the boards in the Hall. Christian bookshops are increasingly rare and visitors to the town are often delighted to find us. As well as the books, cards, gifts and household items, we've got a popular plant stall, we act as a ticket agency for church events, people come in to ask directions, or for a chat or to ask for advice. We do far more than sell things!
