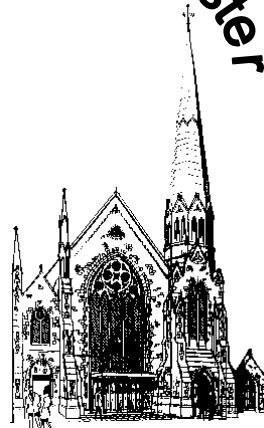

Meetings, meetings, meetings!

Like most organisations, a busy church cannot function well without meetings. We meet to review our projects, take decisions, plan for the future and listen carefully to each other's views.

Our Church Meetings are a key part of how we do things at UCD and we value the input from the congregation. We have a membership of over 170 and in 2025 the average attendance, including at the AGM, was 41 (only 27 of us were at the November Church Meeting). Perhaps these meetings are becoming too boring for some, or maybe we are not addressing the issues that matter most to our members. We are determined to improve our Church Meetings so please pass on your thoughts on what topics you would like to have discussed either by speaking to John or one of the Church Stewards. Alternatively, jot down your ideas on the 'Church Meeting' slips and post them in the box in the Foyer.

John and the Church Stewards have also been discussing our schedule of meetings and how we can be more efficient. The conclusion reached is not to hold more meetings but less. The Church Stewards have a remit to work within a specific team or committee along with their other responsibilities. So, to focus more on these key areas, the Council of Stewards will now be reducing our meetings to 6 times per annum, which is in line with the UCD Constitution.

We also propose to reduce the number of our Church Meetings (Ordinary Congregational Meetings) from three to two. This would mean that, from 2027 onwards, there would be no Church Meeting in February. When pressing matters have arisen during the year, we have successfully held single-item agenda Church Meetings.

These changes will bring us more in line with other Churches in the Circuit, reduce the amount of printed paper (sometimes over 400 sides for one Church Meeting) and reduce the workload of our hard-working Minister.

Therefore, at the next Church Meeting on **Monday 16th February 2026**, we will put forward a resolution to have two Church Meetings (in July and November) not three, plus the Annual General Meeting (in April). As this is a change to our Constitution, at least 20% of our membership need to attend and for the vote to pass it will require a clear majority of at least two-thirds of those eligible to vote at the meeting. Please make a note in your diary and we look forward to hearing about what other topics you would like discussed.
